**Position Overview:** The U. S. Probation Office, Mobile, Alabama, is seeking qualified applicants who are self-motivated with excellent interpersonal skills and a strong work ethic for a full-time probation officer position.

## **Representative Duties:**

- Develop and maintain a broad knowledge of and commitment to the Probation Office Mission, policies, function, and procedures.
- Conduct investigations and prepare reports for the Court, with recommendations for sentencing of individuals convicted of federal offenses, to include interviewing offenders and their families, and investigating the offense. Visit various law enforcement agencies, police departments, and local agencies to collect and record information for both presentence reports and collateral investigations.
- Present presentence reports and sentencing recommendations to the Court. Respond to judicial officer's request for information and advice. Testify in court as to factual findings and guideline applications.
- Supervise offenders to maximize adherence to imposed conditions, reduce risk to the community, and to provide correctional treatment, by utilizing Evidence Based Practices (EBP).
- Maintain personal contact with offenders through office and community visits and by telephone. Investigate employment, sources of income, lifestyle and associates, to assess risk and compliance. Responsible for detection of substance abuse.
- Complete investigative reports, conduct preliminary interviews, and other investigations.
- Comply with established training and safety standards for carrying of firearms, upon approval of the Chief U. S. Probation Officer.
- Compliance with the Code of Conduct for Judicial Employees and court confidentiality requirements, and consistently demonstrate sound ethics and judgment.
- Perform other appropriate duties as assigned.

<u>Oualifications</u>: A successful candidate must be a graduate of an accredited college or university, with a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice or a related field, and must have experience relating to the functions of this position. The incumbent must also demonstrate effective verbal and written communication skills. Computer skills and the ability to type proficiently are required. An advanced degree is preferred. The candidate must also possess the ability to complete multiple projects\_simultaneously with limited supervision, work under pressure, and to learn diverse procedures and criminal rules.

**Law Enforcement Officer Conditions of Employment:** Probation and pretrial services officer and assistants may not have reached their 37<sup>th</sup> birthday at the time of appointment. The selected candidate must pass a medical exam and drug screen prior to appointment. The selected candidate will be subject to random drug screening, and updated background investigations every five years.
